SCRLC covers 10,000 square miles in a fourteen-county region (Allegany, Broome, Cayuga, Chemung, Chenango, Cortland, Delaware, Otsego, Schuyler, Seneca, Steuben, Tioga, Tompkins, and Yates). As a multi-type library consortium, SCRLC serves about 70 member libraries & organizations--20 academic, 18 hospital, and 22 corporate and non-profit libraries, 3 public library systems, and 6 school library systems and their members, reaching over 500 libraries.

How SCRLC adds value for school libraries

Advocacy. Joint efforts of the NY3Rs, NYLA, NYALS, and SLSA restored \$3 million of the proposed \$6 million in cuts to Library Aid.

CE & Networking. SCRLC offers low cost, relevant, quality learning opportunities often with nationally-recognized experts. Special interest groups & networking events are also available. SCRLC is happy to partner with the schools for CE events.

Customized Services. Deposit accounts, individualized discussion/distribution mailing lists.

Digital Services. Participate in New York Heritage Digital Collections (www.NewYorkHeritage.org), a research portal for students, educators, historians, genealogists, and others interested in the Empire State's history. A good source to enhance curricula.

Field Visits & Consultations. Annual visits that can be customized to fit your library system needs. Customized training is also available.



Focus Groups. Focus group facilitation can run into the \$1000's. SCRLC is available to conduct low or no-cost focus groups for your library system.

Professional Development. Participate as a Board member or serve on one of SCRLC's five advisory committees.

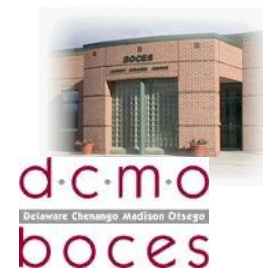
Resource Sharing.

- The Bibliographic and Referral Service (BARC), a free, reliable, last-resort interlibrary loan service. BARC also offers no-cost Union List of Serials maintenance.
- Resource sharing subsidy, as funds permit
- Medical Information Services
